## The 1835 Miller - Ellwood cabin is a work in progress

The new oak logs that filled in places in the walls where the original logs were cut out will weather gray to match the old logs. The new oak logs were hand adzed to match the old logs. The spaces between the logs will be chinked to fill in gaps.

Oak plank doors and floors will be worked on this winter. The windows in the cabin are temporary to keep weather out. Old looking windows will be put in window frames and window frames will weather to a gray color. The oak beams in cabin will be hand adzed to look old. The concrete pad that the boulder and plaque is on will be hidden with field stone and limestone like the foundation wall under the logs.
