January 2016. Maintenance and safety checks of buildings and grounds, seasonal mowing, firewood cutting splitting and stacking, storm clean-up, shelter house and toilet cleaning, litter pick-up and disposal, road grading, trail maintenance, equipment maintenance, scheduling shelter rentals and collecting shelter and camping fees, drinking water sampling. Shelter houses and Lodge are used every weekend by scouts, families and other groups. Natural Resource Center Educational Staff teaching school groups at Russell Woods and making classroom visits. PDRMA Risk Management and Loss Control review and preserve safety in progress for 2016 compliance.

Forest Preserve staff completed a 30 acre " frost seeding" at the Sycamore Forest Preserve ( former Evergreen Village). The prairie seed will melt through the snow, germinate and work it's way into soil. About 40 species of prairie grasses and flowers were in the seed mix. Some of the seed was purchased and some of the seed was havested from DeKalb County forest preserve prairies. It will take 2-3 years for most of the plants to set roots and bloom. This area will have hiking and cross –country ski trails through the prairie. At the end of March there will be a draft landscape design for review for Sycamore Forest Preserve including parking areas, green space, trails, Great Western Trail connection and trail head, picnic areas, picnic shelters , interpretive trails, information signage, and fishing pond.

## January 2016- Projects : Central and Southern forest preserves

Continued brush cutting with the front end mower (Brush Cat) in several locations.
Prairie remnant along great western trail, Bi-Centennial grove at Afton, and the future park areas at the Sycamore Prairie.

The Bi-Centennial grove at Afton has some nice Oaks and Hickories that were planted 1976 by Terry and others. Many of these trees have grown to a nice size. Invasive shrubs (Honeysuckle and Autumn Olive) had moved into the area. Most of these shrubs were removed by the mowing and the grove now more resembles an open savanna. Future plans include seeding with native savanna grasses and forbs and a prescribed fire.

- Prepared seed mixes for the prairie at Sycamore Forest Preserve. The weekly stewards group assisted us with this.
- Picked up drop seeder from Nachusa Grasslands (a big thank you to them) and seeded the future prairie at Sycamore forest preserve. With the exception a few equipment issues this project went smoothly. Overall it took Al, Dale and I two days to complete. We are very excited to see how this prairie matures. This growing season we will monitor weeds and spray and mow as needed.
- Painted gates for Sannauk Forest Preserve-Will install in spring
- Continued painting garbage barrels for southern preserves. All barrels in southern preserves will be a uniform brown color.
- Built bird houses with the weekly stewards group.
- Cleared of debris from trails at Sannauk.
- Equipment cleaning and maintenance.
- Continued updating shop at Afton.
- Snowplowing
