# Ordinance O2017-02: Establishing a Period of Assessment of Commercial Wind Towers and Commercial Solar Farms/Gardens

Motion

Mr. Faivre moved that the DeKalb County Board hereby approves to establish a period of assessment of the real impacts, positive and negative, of an approved commercial wind farm, during which period there shall be no action on any Special Use Permit and Amendments to Special Use Permit applications for the construction and operation of commercial electricity-generating wind towers within unincorporated DeKalb County and no action shall be taken on commercial solar farms/gardens, said period of assessment to commence upon execution of this Ordinance and to continue for a period of eighteen (18) months or until a fully adopted sustainability ordinance is in place, whichever comes first. Furthermore, this Ordinance hereby repeals and supersedes any Ordinance and any section, article or provision of the DeKalb County Code to the extent that such Ordinance and any section, article or provision of the DeKalb County Code is in conflict with any provision of this Ordinance. Any such Ordinance and any section, article or provision of the DeKalb County Code so in conflict with any provision of this Ordinance shall however remain in full force and effect as the same might relate to any other application or request other than for the approval of electricity generating wind towers. Mr. Jones seconded the motion as presented.

#### Motion to Amend

Mr. Reid moved to offer an amendment to the Ordinance in order to provide more clarification: Mr. Reid made a motion to have the Ordinance read as follows: The DeKalb County Board hereby approves to establish a moratorium for a period of assessment of the real impacts, positive and negative, of an approved commercial wind farm, during which period there shall be no action on any Special Use Permit and Amendments to Special Use Permit applications for the construction and operation of commercial electricity-generating wind towers within unincorporated DeKalb County and no action shall be taken on commercial solar farms/gardens, said period of assessment to commence upon execution of this Ordinance and to continue for a period of eighteen (18) months or until a fully adopted sustainability ordinance is in place, whichever comes first. Furthermore, this Ordinance hereby repeals and supersedes any Ordinance and any section, article or provision of the DeKalb County Code to the extent that such Ordinance and any section, article or provision of the DeKalb County Code is in conflict with any provision of this Ordinance. Any such Ordinance and any section, article or provision of the DeKalb County Code so in conflict with any provision of this Ordinance shall however remain in full force and effect as the same might relate to any other application or request other than for the approval of electricity generating wind towers. Mr. Jones seconded the motion as presented. Mr. Porterfield seconded the amendment.

## Voice Vote on Amendment

The Board approved the amendment unanimously by voice vote.

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Mr. Belanger of South Grove Township questioned how the 18 month time-frame was established. Mr. Faivre noted that the Committee thought 18 months was an appropriate amount of time to cap the Committee off at and seemed like a realistic time for them to assess and execute an Ordinance regarding Commercial Wind Towers and Commercial Solar Farms/Gardens.

Mr. Belanger additionally wanted to recognize and thank the County Board and Planning & Zoning Committee for their efforts and time in working on this process. Placing a moratorium on Wind & Solar Farms until an Ordinance can be written is a step in the right direction to protect the property and to be good stewards of the land. He and the surrounding neighbors, collectively as a group, support the moratorium on Wind & Solar Farms and look forward to working with the County Board to develop an Ordinance that will suit the needs and protect the residence property right for years to come. They ask that this process be driven by both the Board and Community Members. He continued that this is the time to create an Ordinance that will allow for future generations to carry out the legacy in conservation and improving the environment.

The Resident of Malta questioned the Board on what would happen if an Ordinance was not passed within the 18 months. Mr. Faivre noted that that in his opinion that they should have something written up within the 18-month timeframe and even if the time limit approaches and they are in the process, they would not abandon their efforts in executing an Ordinance. He additionally asked and it was clarified that testing towers were not included in this moratorium Ordinance.

#### Voice Vote on Amended Ordinance

Chairman Pietrowski called for a voice vote on the Ordinance as Amended. All Members voted yea. Motion carried unanimously.

The hours were spent 3.83 per 179 patients in the Nursing Home. This number exceeds IL State requirements. The State requires 2.5 hours per day for Intermediate Care residents and 3.8 hours per day for Skilled Nursing Care residents. Since the comments regarding the Nursing Home were raised, the State came out and did a thorough inspection of the facility and could find no violations with the facility. The DeKalb County Rehab & Nursing Center still maintains a five-star rating which they take very seriously. At the conclusion of the Health & Human Services Committee Meeting, the Committee Members felt that the DeKalb County Rehab & Nursing Center is in good hands and that the residents are receiving quality care. Ms. Little lastly noted, that Mr. Becker offered the County's Nursing Home to Ottawa Residents and to help assist them in any way possible after a tornado came through earlier in the month and heavily damaged the Nursing Home there.
